

50th International Eucharistic Congress

Today is the **Feast of Corpus Christi** and for Ireland this year it is a special day as the 50th International Eucharistic Congress opens in Dublin and will continue until June 17th with the closing ceremony in Croke Park. Each parish in the diocese was allocated a specific number of tickets for the closing ceremony, we have 25 parishioners travelling to attend same.

Over the past few years lots of preparation have gone into this event and it is an opportunity for the Irish Church to welcome pilgrims from around the world and the country to celebrate our common faith in Jesus Christ. The first International Eucharistic Congress was held in Lille, France in 1881, thereafter every four years. **Dublin hosted the 31st Congress from** June 21st-26th in 1932. The daily celebration of the Eucharist is at the heart of the congress. The wider programme includes other liturgical events, cultural events, catechesis and workshops.


The theme of the 50th Congress is The Eucharist: communion with Christ and with one another, but what does "communion" mean? Many people associate the word strictly with the Blessed Sacrament, but the idea of communion is far broader than that. Communion is a relationship of mutual love and self giving which flows from our relationship with Jesus Christ. The Last Supper is a unique moment of communion, while the supper comes to an end the communion initiated continued to sustain the disciples for what was ahead.

The challenge for the 2012 congress in one of deepening communion. We need to rediscover the meaning of the presence of Jesus among us. We pray to the Lord for the fruits of the Congress that **He will renew us** in our communion with Him and with One Another.
