# **Hang in There**

It's not easy hanging in there when things are going wrong. We sometimes can't because we run out of steam. Our energy is gone and we can't keep going. Moses certainly is an example of staying power.

As long as he believed God stayed with him he kept going and he hung in there. He held out the staff of God over the people and as long as he did so they were successful against their enemies. He needed people to hold him up when he got tired. He couldn't do it on his own. But, he accepted their help and physical support.

The widow in the gospel story persisted against all the odds. She was fully intent on getting justice and she kept after the judge until she succeeded. For ourselves, we too, have to keep up and persist. Like the widow and Moses we might have to hang in there for a while but it will be worth it. God will prevail and our prayers will be answered.

As Pope Francis said recently: "All of us experience moments of fatigue and discouragement, especially when our prayers seem ineffective. But Jesus assures us: unlike the unjust judge, God promptly answers his children, although this does not mean he does it in the time and manner that we would like. Prayer is not a magic wand! It helps to preserve our faith in God, and to trust in Him even when we do not comprehend His will. In this, Jesus himself - who prayed so much! – is the example.

"We ask the Lord for a faith which becomes unceasing prayer, persevering, like that of the widow in the parable, a faith that is nourished by the desire of his arrival. And in this prayer we experience the compassion of God, like a Father who comes to meet his children full of merciful love."

## **Team Hope Shoe Box Appeal**

It is that time of year again when it is time to start planning **Team Hope Shoe Box Appeal** *in Ballinhassig Parish*.

It's been another difficult year for many economically, weatherwise in the spring and autumn, personal loss and tragedies, illness and bereavement, but for the children who receive your shoe box gift it will have an impact far greater than you can imagine, as well as all the great gifts, you will bring smiles laughter and hope to children who think the world has forgotten them.



Worldwide recession makes no difference to them, they live with recession and poverty all their life. They are forgotten children, victims of war, diseases and poverty, living on the edge in some of the poorest countries in the world. Christmas is just another ordinary day, nothing special, no Christmas tree, no presents. But your shoebox can bring a little hope and a practical expression of God's love at Christ-

mas time. A shoebox won't change the world, but it might just change the world for one child, it can do far more than we can imagine, by bringing Christmas to children who have never experienced anything like it before.

The project simply works by asking people to fill an average sized shoe box or plastic container, wrap the box and lid separately with Christmas paper. This year boxes from Ireland will once again go to Eastern

Europe and Africa. The boxes are given to children regardless of their nationality, political background or religious beliefs.

Because it is Christmas, whenever it is culturally appropriate and in consultation with local people the children, along with their box may be offered a booklet telling the story of the nativity and the life of Jesus.



You choose whether you would like your box to go to a boy or girl and what age group, 2-4; 5-9; 10-14.

All boxes are opened by volunteers at the collection centres simply to check they are ok for contents and customs purposes. (our boxes will go to a collection centre in Blackpool, Cork)

The boxes are then sealed, sent by truck or container and will only be opened again by the receiving child.
