Fr. Christy writes

Create a Sacred Space

Everyone thinks about what they are going to give up for Lent and what extra they can do for the good of their soul. Penance is good, it reminds us of Jesus' sacrifice on the cross, it causes us to remember our humanity and it purifies us in more ways than one.

This year, conscious that we might not all have religious objects in our homes, I would like to invite you to bring the Lord and prayer into your home for Lent by creating a special space. It doesn't have to be big, it can be a corner of a unit or a small table but it can become a spiritual focus during Lent, after all Lent is a spiritual journey.

A blue or purple cloth would be best, but any colour will do. On this, place a candle or nightlight, a cross and a Bible. Your Sunday Mass leaflet will do. Make a point of sometime; even for a minute or two, to stop and gather as a family, and to say a simple prayer maybe you'd like to use the following prayer from the children's Alive O book.

"Jesus in the wilderness, in those moments when I choose to do without and find it difficult – Help me, strengthen me with thoughts of others who do without and have no choice. *Amen.*"

St. Patrick Patron of Ireland

It can be difficult to separate fact from fiction in the life of *St. Patrick*, not unusual when he was probably born more than 1,600 years ago. His life is a wonderful example of how God brings good out of evil. He tells us in his "confessions" how he was brought to Ireland to work as a slave at the age of sixteen, until that time he had little knowledge of God.



In his loneliness and isolation he discovered the Lord, praying as many as 1000 prayers by day and the same by night as he tended the sheep on Sliabh Migh. Finally escaping, prob-


ably to France, he could not forget the needs of the pagans in Ireland.

He was consecrated bishop at the age of forty three. In a dream it seemed the people of Ireland were calling on him to return. Patrick took this as a call from God and lit a flame on the hill of *Tara* on *Holv Saturday*

night which has never since been extinguished.



During this time he converted many, ordained priests, divided the country into dioceses, held church councils, founded
