A Thirst For Eternity

I can't even begin to imagine what it's like to thirst. Many countries throughout the world have to regularly deal with drought where every drop of water is precious. For us in Ireland there has been, in recent times, great controversy over water and conserving it. We tend, because we have so much rain, to take it for granted.

Led by Moses, God's people are wandering in the desert, they get fed up of all their travels and again start grumbling. God continues to provide for them. Moses strikes the rock as God commanded and there is more than enough to satisfy their thirst this time.

The Samaritan woman is an outsider and yet Jesus takes the time to stop and ask her for a drink of water. At that time, it would be unheard of for a man to approach a woman like that, let alone a Samaritan. But, Jesus draws her into conversation. He awakens something within her; her search, and her thirst, her need to be fulfilled by God. She experiences Jesus is a special and wonderful and enriching way. He opens up the won-


Daffodil Day in Ireland


and support for patients and advocate for improvements in cancer care and treatment.
