## LORD, THAT I MAY SEE!

In recent years there has been a wonderful campaign associated with Pieta House. It is called 'darkness into light'. A worthy cause that has received a lot of deserved support. In the parish we will celebrate our journey of darkness into light on Easter Sunday with our dawn Mass.

In reality it is the journey of all Christians, a journey that takes us through Lent, reminding us that we in sin, live in darkness and we journey to Easter and to Jesus the Light of the World.



In our Gospel Jesus transforms the life of the man born blind. He has lived in darkness all of his life

#### Mothers Day in Ireland?

The history of celebrating *Mothering Sunday or Mothers Day* in Ireland can be traced to the medieval practice where children from poor families were sent to work as domestic servants and apprentices to work with the rich.

Once in the year in the middle of Lent the chil-

dren were given a day off to visit their '*Mother Church*' and worship the Virgin Mary. After ' visiting the Mother Church or Cathedral of their home town

these children visited their mothers and presented them with flowers they picked along the way. Some girls baked a special Mothering Cake on the day.

Patterns of living changed after the Industrial Revolution and Mothering Sunday celebrations almost lapsed. The custom was revived after World War 11.

We now celebrate Mothers Day on the fourth Sunday of Lent.

On this day people present their mothers with cards, flowers and () other gifts to express love and gratitude.
