

Fr. Christy writes

ST. PATRICK A LIGHT FOR ALL

As we celebrate St Patrick's Day, we recall many of the stories and legends attached to his memory. One focuses on him lighting a fire on the Hill Of Tara, a fire that acknowledged pagan fires and customs of the past but paved a way for a new awareness of the Light of Christ. In many ways, we have sought to keep that flame alive ever since –passing it carefully, in story, through sacraments, prayer and liturgy, from one generation to the next. Our presence here today, gathered in faith on St Patrick's Day, may well be attributed to that flame. We seek to protect it, to be protected by it and to share it with a new generation. It is about neighbours minding neighbours, taking the flame and sheltering it that it may ever burn brightly.

They tell us that St Patrick, in a dream, heard the cry of the Irish begging him to come back to them. Though here as a captive and now free and away from us, there was somewhere in him a belief that this distant voice could not be ignored. Not alone did he return, but he returned with purpose to bring us into relationship with Trinity. "I bind unto myself today, the strong name of the Trinity, by invocation of the same, the three in one, the one in three". Patrick truly made a difference and, as one nation to that one man, we say "buiochas" today.

The eyes of the world focus on Ireland today. From Sydney Opera House to the Eifel Tower buildings and landmarks turn green. Parades will take place in every corner of Ireland and throughout the world and St Patrick will be celebrated. Sadly, it has to be said, much of the celebration will avoid meaningful mention of his name and the day will be referred to as "Paddy's Day" or something along those lines. Call it what they will, the truth remains that at the heart of this day lies a man who sought to make a difference, to light a fire and nourish a flame of faith.

"Christ be my unchanging friend, guide and shepherd to the end."

St. Patrick Patron of Ireland

It can be difficult to separate fact from fiction in the life of St. Patrick, not unusual when he was probably born more than 1,600 years ago. His life is a wonderful example of how God brings good out of evil. He tells us in his "confessions" how he was brought to Ireland to work as a slave at the age of sixteen, until that time he had little knowledge of God.



In his loneliness and isolation he discovered the Lord, praying as many as 1000 prayers by day and the same by night as he tended the sheep on Sliabh Migh. Finally escaping, probably to France, he

could not forget the needs of the pagans in Ireland.

He was consecrated bishop at the age of forty three. In a dream it seemed the people of Ireland were calling on him to return. Patrick took this as a call from God and lit a flame on the hill of *Tara* on Holy Saturday night which has never since been extinguished.

During this time he converted many, ordained priests, divided the country into dioceses, held church councils, founded several monasteries for both sisters and brothers, throughout the country. Patrick is the Patron Saint and credited with bringing Christianity to Ireland.

The "Breastplate" of Saint Patrick gives us a good example of his spirituality.

Christ with me. Christ before me, Christ behind me. Christ in me. Christ beneath me. Christ above me, Christ on my right, Christ on my left,




