

# **Father, Son and Holy Spirit**

This week I quote from an American Dominican Fr. John J. Boll, whose reflection on the Sunday scriptures I like to read.

"Jesus of Nazareth is the lens through which Paul interprets the Trinity. Paul tells us, "Therefore, since we have been justified through faith..." That's where it begins for us, doesn't it? It is not about what we did to please God; but that God has first been pleased with us. God, in Jesus, has "justified" us. The term "justification" is the Bible's assurance that we have been put in right relationship with God. Because of what Jesus has done for us, we are now at peace with God and ourselves.

The way someone acts gives insight into who they are. Paul teaches that being put right with God and acting like Christ in the world through the Spirit, fixes our gaze, not only on the present world, but on the future glory we will share with God and one another. Jesus realized that we need the reassurance our faith gives us. So at the Last Supper he promised us his Spirit to "guide you to all truth."

But also note how reassuring he is about God's love being "poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given us." Once again, there is the promise of the glory we will one day have; we who have been gifted with the Spirit of Jesus that enables us to persevere through trials. Paul says we have "gained access by faith to this grace in which we stand." One translation for "access" is "safe haven or harbor." So, grace has provided us a secure place in God's presence as we face affliction because of our faith.

Paul was speaking to Christians under trials to help them understand their identity and responsibility as followers of Jesus Christ. Here and elsewhere, he describes the basis for our faith and its consequences in the lives of Christians. We can talk about

the Trinity in quite reasoned tones but, for Paul, the Trinity was up close, and very active each day as our Creator, Redeemer and Sanctifier."
