CHILDREN OF THE RESURRECTION

In the time before Jesus people didn't believe in the resurrection and so we hear the questions people ask about it in our readings today. Many of them still didn't believe in the resurrection. Their question is trying to get at how things will be after we die, asking the impossible, trying to catch Jesus out.

Jesus uses the term 'children of the resurrection' to describe his followers. For his followers things will not be like as they are here. But, we are using language and images to describe something which is coming from faith and not from direct knowledge. All we have is Jesus' word and promise.

In reality for us belief in the life hereafter, the resurrection, is a matter of faith, and it's something that cannot be proven. Yet, Jesus' reassurance that death is not the end, that we will follow where he has gone, is what's important to us, especially when we remember all our loved ones gone before us. We believe that the relationship we have with God, which starts in this life, surpasses death and continues in a new way in the resurrection in heaven.

Lord God, whose days are without end,

and whose mercies beyond counting,

keep us mindful that life is short and the hour of death unknown.

Let your spirit guide our days on earth in the ways of holiness and justice,

that we may serve you in union with the whole Church,

sure in faith, strong in hope, perfect in love.
