Diocesan directive...

Re-opening of Churches for Personal Prayer

We all remain very aware of and compliant with Government advice and HSE guidance in regard to Covid-19 —which may change at short notice. With this in mind, from Monday May 18th, churches in the Diocese of Cork and Ross will be **opened for personal prayer only.** This forms part of a phased plan towards being able to celebrate the sacraments with a congregation at a later date.

The following minimum requirements are in place before a church can be opened safely.

- **1. CLEANLINESS**: It is important that churches are kept clean. Churches which have been used recently should be cleaned using disinfectant.
- **2. INFORMATION**: The entrance to the church to have public health information clearly displayed.
- **3. SIGNAGE**: People will be guided by signs and tape/ribbon to follow a one-way path through the church. If possible, the doors should be kept open.
- **4. SANITISE**: Hand sanitiser available at the entrance and at the exit of the church. Everyone must sanitise coming in and going out. A bin for discarded tissues may be placed at the exit.
- **5. DISTANCE**: Physical distance of 2m in every direction from the next person to be maintained (not required by members of the same household, e.g. a parent with children may sit in the same pew).
- **6. VOTIVE LIGHTS**: Please use a glove provided, light a candle and then dispose of the glove in the bin as you leave.

The churches in this parish will open as follows:

BALLYGARVAN 9.30am - 6pm BALLYHEADA. 9.30 am - 8pm GOGGINS HILL 9.30 am - 6pm

Access to the churches be will through the side doors only. Please follows the signs and directions. Before you leave, use a sanitising wipe to clean all surfaces including doors and handles, pews etc. and place in the bin at the exit. People are asked not to use the areas that are taped off to ensure the area is kept clean and sanitised.
