

WHOSE VOCATION IS IT?

"Pope Francis reminds us that holiness is not elitist or an imposed burden. It is an invitation to every human life, to know that each one of us is personally called, chosen and named by God for a kind purpose. Our vocation is to answer this kind invitation." (Fr. John. Cullen writing in Intercom)

Traditionally, on the fourth Sunday of Easter, Good Shepherd Sunday, we focus on praying for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. While this is vital and never more important than now when our need is enormous, it is also a time for us to pray for all God's people that they too hear his call and respond to him in the way they choose to live their life.

As a diocese we are facing the serious challenge of a shortage of priests. We are beginning a stage now, where not all parishes will have their own resident priest. Parishes will need to be reimagined and reshaped as they share the ministry of a priest. That will present a serious challenge for parishioners and for an ever decreasing number of priests who are also growing older. Who would have ever thought or imagined we would face a shortage of priests let alone a parish without a resident priest.

On this Vocations Sunday, as we pray for people to respond to God's call to the priesthood and religious life, we pray too that all members of the faith community (the parish) will respond to God's call and play their part in continuing the mission of preaching the Gospel in our world today.

It is only working together, all of us, priests and people, as members of the faith community, each sharing their gifts and talents, that we can respond to the challenges we face now and into the future for our Church.



So how do we bring about a faith community where everyone has an equal respected and valued voice? *This is what the bishops-and* Pope Francis-are calling 'synodality'

The hope is to have everyone share their insights on the Catholic Church in Ireland and through that process also bring about renewal. But that prompts a first question: how might that happen? What methods might *be useful to create this* 'conversation'
