THE SPIRIT OF GOD

Jesus' promise of an Advocate is fulfilled as are all his promises to us. Spirit filled, the disciples find renewed hope and courage and begin to preach to the multitude in all languages. Speaking the same language, that all may be understood. It is a language of hope, peace and reconciliation. It is the language of faith and the proclaims the Great Story of the Risen Jesus. Tongues of fire, symbolising the coming of the Holy Spirit, is what makes this all possible and as Jesus himself said "The Spirit of truth is the witness, you too will be my witnesses."

The Hebrew word for spirit ("ruah") occurs over 300 times in the Hebrew Scriptures, from the very first chapter of Genesis. "Ruah" means "breath." The beginning of Genesis tells us, God's Spirit was "sweeping over the waters of chaos and darkness. God forms the first human from the soil and breathes life into it and human begins to breathe.

Jesus breathed the Spirit in his disciples and offered them peace, not just for themselves, but for a very concrete purpose, to make peace among those who have sinned and are alienated from God. John assures us today that the Spirit will always be with disciples – as present as their own breath. The Spirit enables us to do what Jesus promised.

May the breath of God bring new life to you. May the fire of the Spirit burn bright within you. May we on this Pentecost be filled, like the disciples with the courage, strength and hope we need to be witnesses today!



Returning to Public Masses
