CORPUS CHRISTI

Today's Gospel opens on the ancient Jewish feast of Unleavened Bread. It celebrates the journey of God's people through the wilderness. Today's feast of Corpus Christi embodies the symbols of the Jewish feast – when Christ becomes the lamb of sacrifice and the bread of eternal life. Our Sunday is a time to pause, pray, ponder. It is a day when we become aware that we are part of God's gift of creation, part of the natural order, whose integrity we are called on to respect.

The Lord chose bread to represent him. He spoke about the grain of wheat falling to the ground, remaining alone and dying, it then bears fruit. Jesus offered us an earthly image to convey what his life was all about. Bread made of grounded-grain flour hides the passionate intensity of the Lord's sacrifice and sacrament of love for us.

Sunday-Sabbath has kept faith alive. Even in the depths of poverty, persecution and the recent pandemic, we saw we were unable to be guests at the God's banquet — where everyone is welcome and has a place around the altar of covenant, celebration, communion and community. No-one should feel exiled or be shown the exit, or have to endure a personal exodus or excommunication in a desert wilderness, away from the people's altar of the Lord's presence of promise and peace.

We are the Body of Christ (Corpus Christi). We need to be always looking to see who is not around the altar – because we are incomplete by their absence. 'Do this in memory of me' is an invitation and not a rigid regulation to be enforced and adhered to.

Today's feast celebrated how one life lived for other can make a difference. This feast tells us that God empowers us to take risks (as Jesus did), lifts us when we fall, believes in us more than we believe in ourselves, forgives our failings, feeds our famished hearts with the food of forgiveness and friendship and stays with us faithfully and forever.
