



Annual Mass for Bereaved November

Most of November we concentrate on remembering our dead. The Holy Souls Novena, the visits to the graveyards are good but they make it impossible for people to avoid being revisited by the pain caused by the death of a loved



one. Here in *Ballinhassig Parish* we have had sad, sudden and untimely deaths this year and in the past few years. Consequently we have many parishioners for whom November is a very sad and lonely month. The thought of facing Christmas without the departed loved one always brings enormous sadness in need of some ray of hope to dispel the darkness of grief and loneliness.

This year conscious of Covid 19 the *Parish Assembly & Parish Funeral Ministry Team* have organised a **Bereavement Mass** in each church instead of the usual one gathering for the whole parish.

All those who suffered a bereavement in the past twelve months, their family members, neighbours and friends have been invited to attend one of the **Special Masses**.

November 22nd Goggins Hill at 7.30pm November 23rd in Ballyheada at 7.30pm November 25th in Ballygarvan at 7.30pm It is hoped this Special Mass will bring a message of hope, comfort and consolation to all who live with the pain of loss, especially the death of a loved one; loss of health both physical and mental and any other loss which we may endure as individuals.

As part of the ceremony candles will be lit before mass to represent your loved ones.

These individual candles will then symbolise a community of hope with all candles then lighting as one.



We are also conscious that we may not be aware of all parishioners who suffered bereavements of family members who resided outside the parish.

The night, however, is not only for those bereaved in the past twelve months, it is a night for remembering and praying for all who are grieving. There is a great tradition of support and understanding in our parish at times of bereavement.

These Masses will be another opportunity to offer sympathy, and support through being present and praying with our bereaved families, neighbours and friends.

Purpose of Church Envelopes?

There are a variety of envelopes used for church collections and many people are confused about what is for what purpose.

In any parish there are two purposes for which money is collected.

PARISH INCOME (maintain parish)
PRIEST INCOME (personal income)

Parish Income comes from:Saturday/Sunday collections
Holyday collections
Standing Orders
Direct Debits
Annual cheques, donations, drafts/
postal orders, etc.
Graves and Tax Refund Scheme.

Parish Income is primarily used for:

Altar supplies (breads, wines, candles, altar linen, church cleaning; Church Heating:- Electricity/Gas/Oil; Insurance, postage and stationery; telephone; Sacristans & secretarial payments; Repairs & maintenance of churches and presbytery;

Monthly Loan Repayment; Diocesan Levies

(8% &10% contributions)
There are two church collections which
go to the priest as part of their income.
The collection on:-

Christmas Day & Easter Sunday.

Priests Income

The priest is not paid a salary from the parish but receives his income from voluntary offerings of parishioners. The way these are collected can vary from parish to parish.

<u>In Ballinhassig parish the priests</u> income comes from the following:

Station Dues – Spring & Autumn
Petrol collection autumn stations
Christmas & Easter Offerings
November Novena Offerings
Baptism Offerings
Marriage & Funeral Offerings
Mass Offerings week end & week day
Mass Cards
Other personal donations.

<u>Special Collections monies</u> are lodged directly to their specific accounts and do not form part of parish income.

Income & Expenditure Accounts for the Parish are submitted annually to the diocese and a copy of same are published in the Ballinhassig Parish Newsletter.
