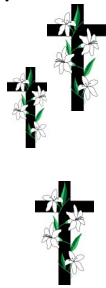

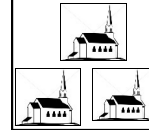

A TIME TO TAKE STOCK

Preparations are in full swing. The Christmas lights and decorations are up in many places. The shops have been promoting their Christmas stock for at least a month now. Yet, if we focus on Christmas only we could be missing the point and miss out on a great opportunity for ourselves this Advent.

Advent is a time of preparation, but if it's not totally about preparing for Christmas, then, what is it for. Advent comes from the Latin word 'coming'. Yes it is about focussing on when Jesus will return, as he promised.

These first weeks of Advent are a time of reflection, preparing for the Lord when he returns. Our reflective preparation is about taking time to take stock of our lives. To pause as it were and see how better I can do things to get ready for the Lord's coming amongst us.

Our scripture readings are pointing us to the end of time and the Lord's judgment. The emphasis is on being people of honesty and integrity. People whose lives are really in tune with the Lord and our Advent prayer of 'watching' ourselves and 'staying awake' is about us being ready to meet him when he comes.

The Advent Wreath



Most churches and families have an Advent Wreath. The custom wasn't always an Irish one. Wreaths were popular in Germany, Austria and Northern Europe. As people began to travel to these countries they saw the attractive wreaths and brought the idea home. This week end we have one in each of our three Churches as this Sunday **November 28th** is the **First Sunday of Advent**. The wreath is a symbol of what Advent means.

ADVENT



The circle represents “**eternity**” and the “**faithfulness**” of God, it never ends. The **evergreen** foliage is a reminder that Jesus is ready to renew our relationship with Him. The **Four Candles** represent the **four weeks of Advent** and each Sunday another one of the candles is lit. Three **purple** candles and one **rose** colour. Purple is the traditional colour for Advent meaning “**Penance**” and the **Rose** colour in lit on the third Sunday which is **Gaudete** Sunday, or a day of **Rejoicing** that the coming of Jesus is near.

So Advent is a time for us to **prepare** to receive Jesus into our **hearts, our lives, our homes and our parish.**

We need to **invite** Him.

A very short traditional prayer for Advent is simply
“**COME LORD JESUS**”



We can say this at any time, travelling, in the house or when we pass a Church or Grotto. Having the Advent Wreath in the house the prayer could be said with children round the wreath, maybe at bedtime or before a meal. Remember when we invite Jesus into our lives **He will never come empty handed.** He will come to you with **some special gift or blessing**, something He knows you need. But you have to be **READY** and **WAITING.** So “**Stay awake**” “**Be ready**” so that He Knows you're expecting Him.
