When God spoke to Moses in the first reading today though, he didn't bring Moses up a mountain or on a long journey. God met Moses where he was and told him that here - this place, this earth, this time - was holy. 'Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place where you stand is holy ground'. In that very ordinary moment, in that very ordinary time, God laid out for Moses a plan that would change the world.

Today's readings remind us that God is interested in the ordinary, not spectacular, that God meets us as we are, where we are. The psalmist sings 'The Lord is kind and merciful, redeems your life from destruction, crowns you with kindness and compassion.'. If you've been struggling, I hope you can hear this love God has for you – just as you are now.

The image of the pruned fig tree can be frightening and make people feel judged or wronged. In fact, any gardener will tell you that a pruning of a tree is a kindness, to allow it to grow healthily and better next year. Much like a decision to get healthier, to declutter or to meet up with friends we haven't seen in a while, pruning is meant to encourage and bring out the best in us.

Here in this moment, is there one small thing you can do to help yourself have a healthier or happier life? A treat, a meditation, a visit to a friend? This Lent, is there one thing you can do to help yourself have a deeper, kinder friendship with your God?

As we think of Thandekile, Nomatter and Forward this week, we think of Moses pressing his face into the African soil and recognising God present with him. We remember that God wants every person created to have the

possibility of good health and a good life. There is some unique purpose for every person in Thandekiles community, state and country, and we are in a position to contribute to the pruning and upbuilding of these communities by supporting education, access to clean water and support of local enterprise. May we too take off our shoes and recognise that we stand on holy ground when we stand for the dignity and values of every person.
