



Loving those with whom we agree or are partial to is the easy part. Loving the rest of those we come into contact with is a much harder proposition. Reality is ... it's much easier to love those who are more loving and lovable. It is said that John, in his old age, would remind those around him to love one another. When questioned why he told them this so very often, his reply would be, 'Because it is what our Lord commanded. If it is all you do, then it is enough.

The way that Jesus talks about loving each other is a precursor of the spread of Christianity. As he loved and that love spread within his inner circle, so too will love spread after he is gone when love is done in his name.


