

. Purple vestments are worn by the priest during Lent.

The *Gloria and Alleluia* are not prayed during Lent.

.. Decoration of the sanctuary and altar are simple during Lent.

Lent is a time to give up or take up in preparation for Easter.

On **February 11th in 1858**, Our Lady first appeared at Lourdes to 14 year old **Bernadette Soubirous**. Later Bernadette was to learn that the mysterious Lady was the Blessed Virgin and to hear from her lips, 'I am the Immaculate Conception.'

In 1992 Pope John Paul 11 instituted the *World Day of the Sick* to be held each year on the commemoration of **Our Lady of Lourdes on February 11th.**

In his message for **World Day of the Sick**, **2024** Pope Francis focuses on "It is not good that man should be alone"

Healing the Sick by Healing Relationships.

Lord Jesus, who healed the sick, We pray for all who are not well. Be their help and strength And bless all who care for them.





February 14th Feast Day of St. Valentine

Saint Valentine was a Catholic priest who had also worked as a doctor. He lived in Italy during the third century AD and served as a priest in Rome. Historians don't know much about Valentine's early life, they pick up his story after he began working as a priest. Valentine became famous for

marrying couples who were in love but couldn't get legally married in Rome during the reign of Emperor Claudius II, who outlawed **weddings**. Saint Valentine sent a farewell note to a young blind girl named Julia before he was martyred for his faith in Jesus Christ and signed it



"From your Valentine," which led to the tradition of sending loving messages on his feast day, Valentine's Day.
